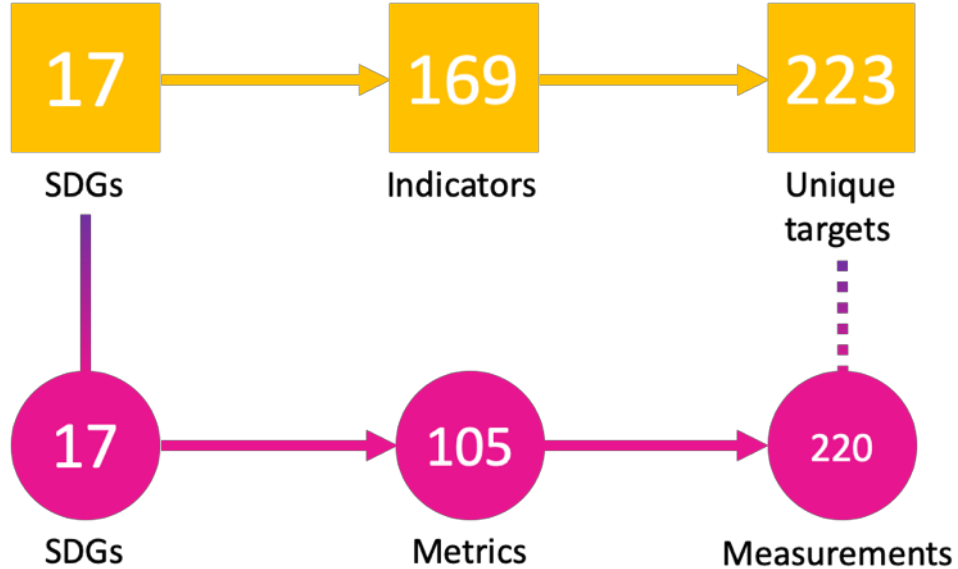

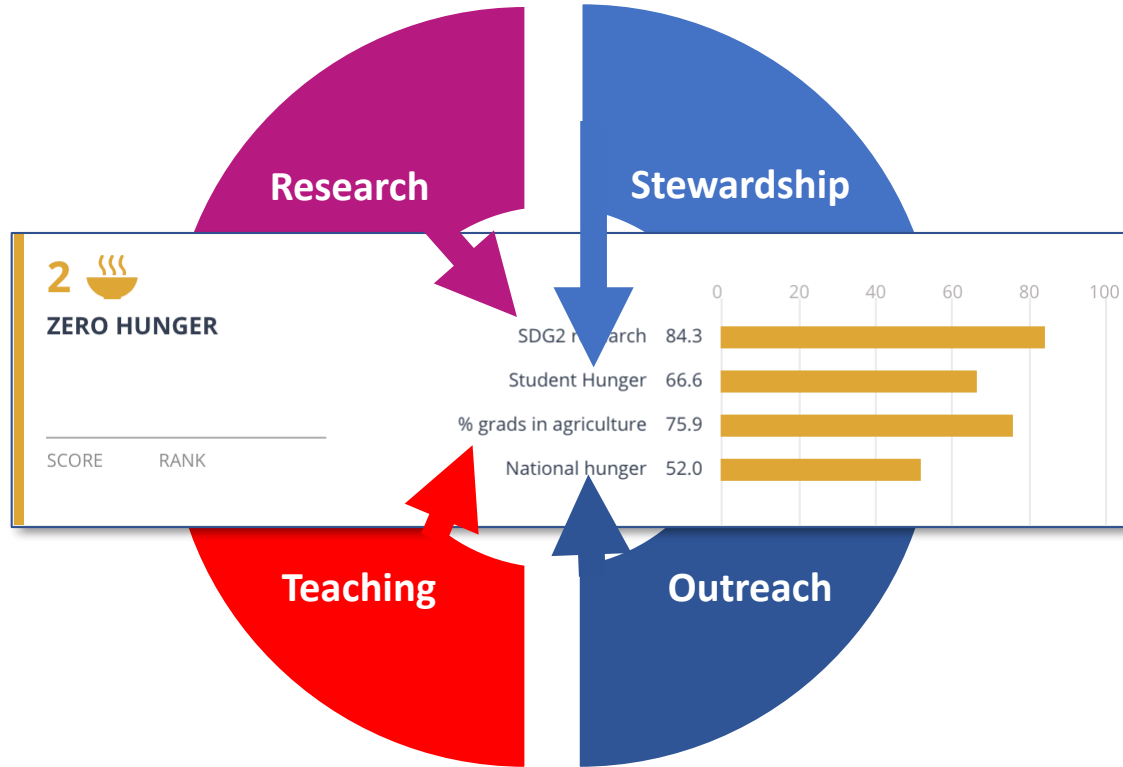

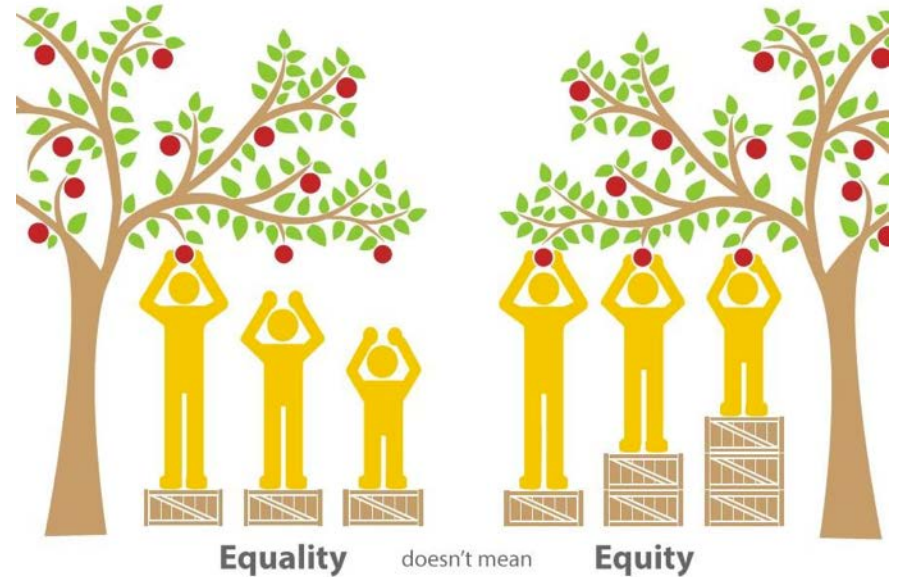


FOUR ASPECTS OF THEORY OF CHANGE



HOW TO BE EQUITABLE?

- Ease of participation
- Minimise SDGs in submission
 - 17 plus any three others
- Think carefully about metrics
- Listen to input from universities, organisations, and individuals



THE OVERALL RANKING

- An overall score is created from SDG 17 and the three strongest SDGs for a university
- Universities could submit to as many SDGs as they wished
- Bibliometrics will always represent the same proportion of overall score, regardless of SDGs chosen

$$17 + A + B + C$$

$$22 + 26 + 26 + 26 = 100$$

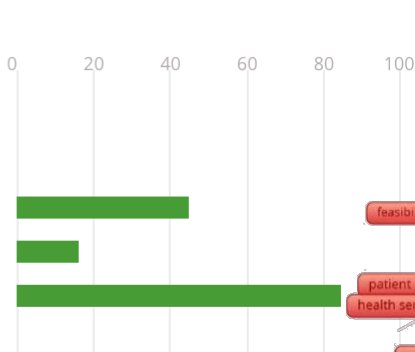

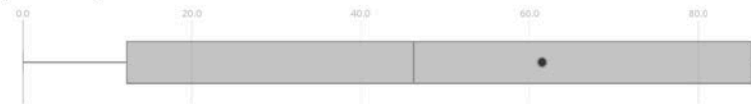

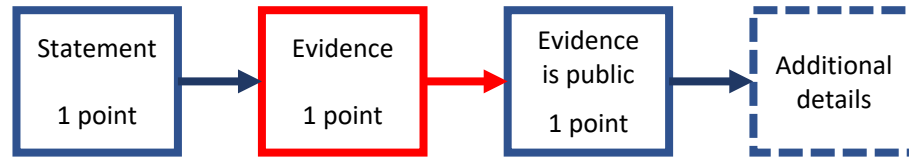

EVALUATING EVIDENCE

How do we calculate the score for evidence?

Supporting arts and heritage looks at evidence around the following activities:

- Public access to significant buildings at the university



Maximum possible 3pts

Evidence is evaluated for relevance:

- 1 point specific
- 0.5 point general
- 0pt point not relevant

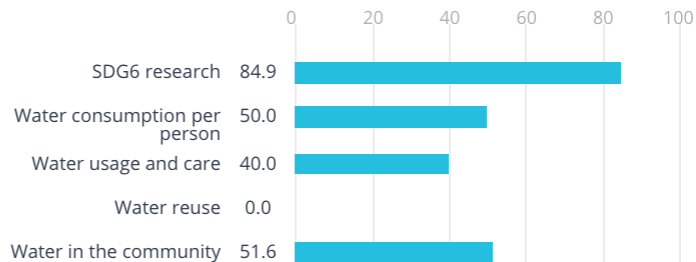

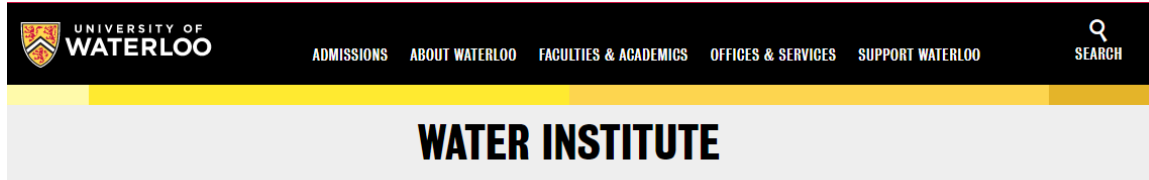

SDG 5: Gender Equality

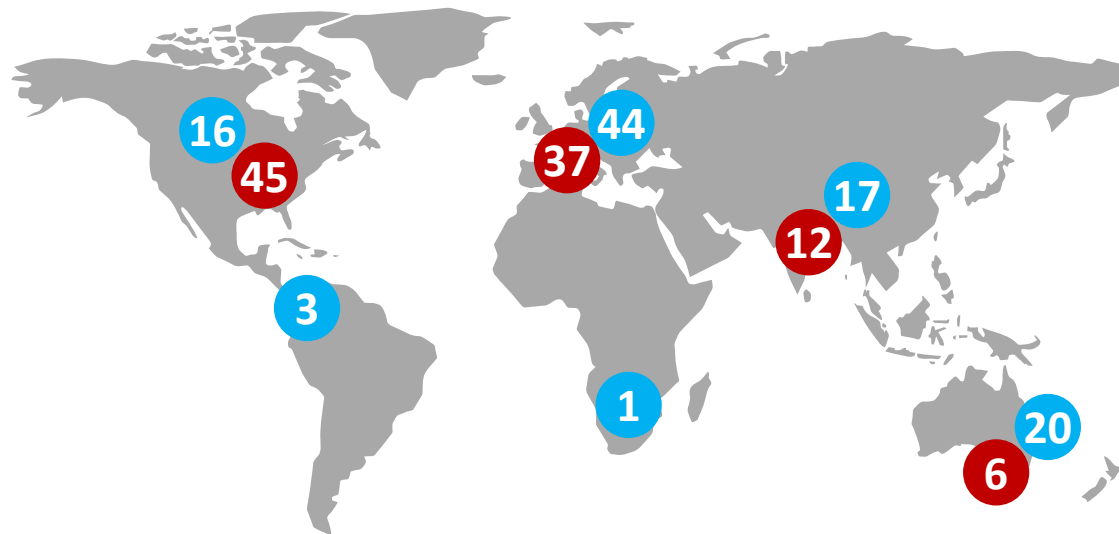

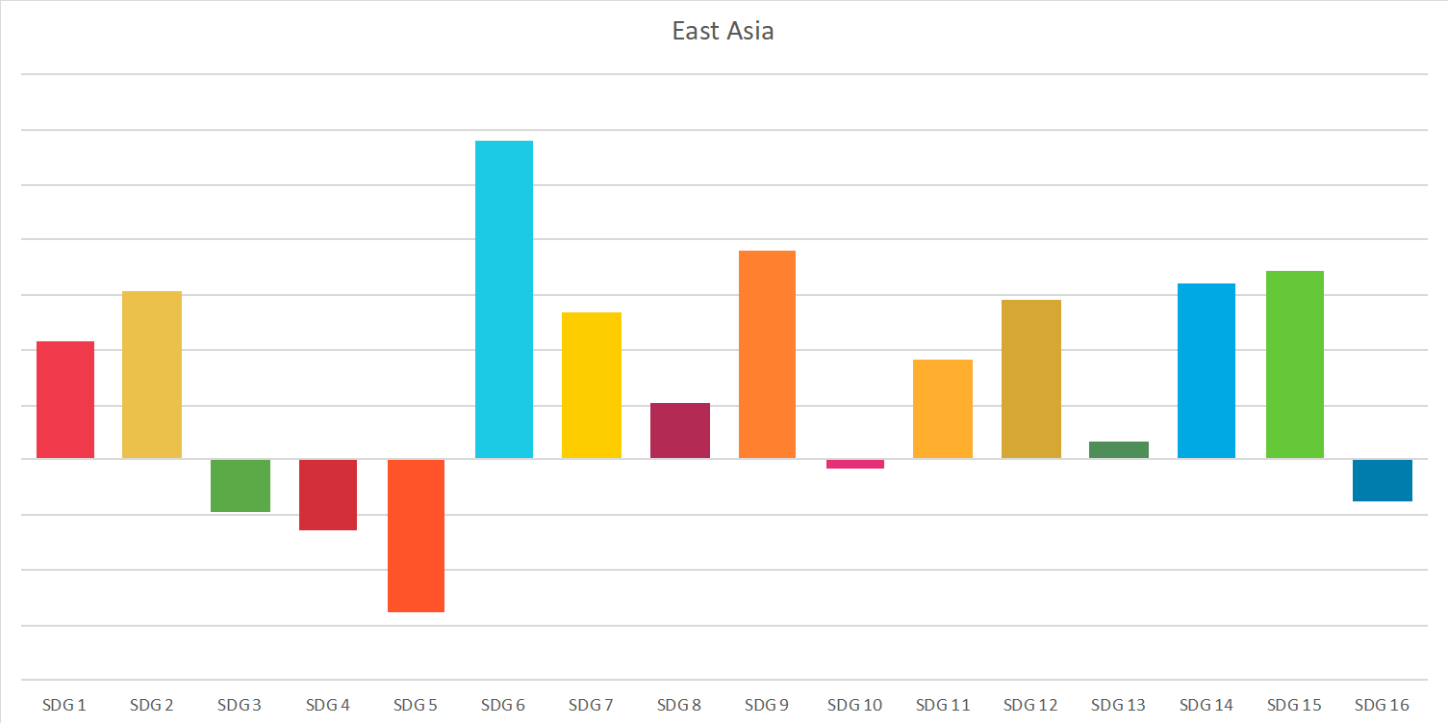
PARTICIPATION FOR 2020: 850+ UNIVERSITIES

Changes and key dates



ENTRY CRITERIA CHANGED

- Postgraduate only institutions can now participate
- Definitions rewritten to make this clear, but previous calculation approaches should still be valid
- “Good standing” criteria adopted rather than “Accredited”
- University perimeter definition

OTHER GENERAL CHANGES

- Additional guidance
- Naming consistency work
- More detailed methodology published in advance of portal opening
- Portal usability enhanced
- Metric measurements only



- Question 2.2 – Food Waste
- Now split into two questions
 - Evidence based: Do you measure food waste
 - Numeric: amount of food waste
- You can only receive a score for the second question if you answer positively to the first

SDG6: CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION



- Question 6.2 – Water usage
- Now split into two questions
 - Evidence based: Do you track water consumption
 - Numeric: amount of water consumed per square meter
- You can only receive a score for the second question if you answer positively to the first

SDG6: CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION



- Question 6.4 – Water reuse
- Now split into two questions
 - Evidence based: Do you have a water reuse policy
 - Evidence based: Do you measure water reuse



- Question 12.3 – Waste Recycling
- Now split into two questions
 - Evidence based: Do you measure the amount of waste generated and recycled
 - Numeric: How much waste is recycled
- Note – we measure waste generated, recycled, and sent to landfill



- Question 13.4 – Carbon Neutrality Commitment
- Now split into two questions
 - Evidence based: Commitment to Scope 1, 2 or 3
 - Evidence based: Year of target
- Note – boundaries stay the same from last year



- Question 17.3
- Focus is on measuring university progress against the goals
- New structure for question
- Open data requirement removed

- Ranking launch April 23rd
